Essential Question:

What is the legacy of slavery in America in the 21st Century?

Overview

In this task, you will research the lasting impacts of slavery and write at least a two-page essay in which you explore and identify the legacy of slavery in the 21st Century. Your primary resource will be The 1619 Project.

What is The 1619 Project?

The 1619 Project is an ongoing project developed by The New York Times Magazine in 2019 with the goal of re-examining the legacy of slavery in the United States and timed for the 400th anniversary of the arrival in America of the first enslaved people from West Africa.
