
Response to Literature:

Score	Skill: Response to Literature
1	Student did not address the prompt.
2	Student answered the prompt, but without details.
3	Student answered the prompt and provided one reason to support their idea.
4	Student answered the prompt and provided clear reasons to support their idea

Score	Skill: Conventions	
1	Student did not write recognizable letters/words.	
2	Student copied some letters/words, but they did not have meaning.	
3	Student wrote or copied letters/words with purpose and meaning. Some punctuation may be present (upper case letters, periods, spacing, etc.).	
4	Student wrote a combination of phonetic and conventionally spelled words. Punctuation may be present. Student can read their own writing and may even make revisions.	

Score	Skill: Illustrations	
1	Illustration is not recognizable (ex. scribbling) and/or does not match words.	
2	Illustration is very simple without details (ex. use of one color to draw a single object) and/or has a weak connection to the words.	
3	Illustration is recognizable and includes details (ex. use of multiple colors and several objects) and is connected to the words.	
4	Illustration is easily recognized and includes details (ex. use of multiple colors, several related objects, may include some labels) and is clearly connected to the words.
