

NEGROES WIN SCHOOL FIGHT.

"Jim Crow" Classes Are to be Abolished in East Orange.

After a fight lasting many months a settlement has apparently been reached between the colored people of East Orange and the East Orange Board of Education which, a while ago organized "Jim Crow classes" in the public schools and placed colored children in them.

The members of the Board of Education held a long conference Saturday night with representatives of the colored people and yesterday it was stated that the negro children who have been out of the public schools since the trouble started would return and take examinations so that they could be assigned to proper classes.

There was great rejoicing yesterday among the colored people when announcements were made in their churches.

GRAIN BROKER A SUICIDE.

Business Troubles Thought to Have Made C. C. Cameron Shoot Himself.

Charles C. Cameron, a grain broker, committed suicide yesterday morning behind his house, at 113 Vose Avenue, South Orange, by shooting himself in the temple. His body was found about 7:30 o'clock by members of his family. Mr. Cameron is thought to have become discouraged through business troubles, the firm he was formerly connected with having recently failed.

Up to about six weeks ago Mr. Cameron had been the New York representative of a firm of grain brokers in Chicago. He was a member of the Produce Exchange and had an office in the Produce Exchange Building. People who know him say that he had been worrying considerably over his business for some time. When the Chicago firm failed he got a place with the Wall Street firm of T. A. McIntyre & Co.

Mr. Cameron was born in Maryland forty-two years ago and had lived in the North about a quarter of a century. He leaves a wife and two small children. He was a member of the Board of Governors of the South Orange Field Club and was an expert bowler and an enthusiastic golfer.
