Urban Renewal	The large-scale and comprehensive act or process of renovating or replacing housing and public works considered substandard or outdated.Urban renewal programs often disproportionately impact the elderly, racial minorities, and the poor. Residents in urban renewal areas are often forcibly relocated or cannot afford to live in the newly renovated areas (because of higher taxes or rent) and are thus displaced and replaced by wealthier individuals in a process called gentrification.		
White Flight	Relocation by white residents out of a community or neighborhood in response to an influx of nonwhite people.
