Reading "The 1857 Project: Extracting the Poison of Racism from America's Soul" by William H. Freivogel

Freivogel's opening essay asserts that 1857 was one of the most important chapters in the nation's story. It states: "The soul of America is its promise of ever-expanding freedom, equality and opportunity. The parodox of America is that over four centuries our Founders and our leaders reneged on this promise by embracing a devil's bargain with slavery, segregation, racial superiority and racism."
