Scene:

[Jed walks from left, Alan walks from right]

[Jed bumps into Alan]

[Alan drops his food]

Alan: Oh my god, not you again. Are you blind? Can't you see?

Jed: Relax, it was an accident.

Alan: Did I ask whether it was an accident?

Jed: You were just on your phone!

Alan: Just be quiet already. You should know that someone like me who is more superior than you shouldn't even be in the same place. Now get out of the way, I'm already getting a headache from talking to you.

[Both walk away]

[Knock on invisible door walk in]

Alan: Come in

Alan: What seems to be the problem?

Jed: There's a racist teacher in this school that just called me inferior to him.

Alan: Alright. Thanks for letting me know. I'll do my best to find a proper punishment.

Now that you have seen a representation of what has happened in real life situations, you can clearly see that racism is mainly caused by ego, like how people think they are better than another, and people use that to look down upon others.
